Second Person	You	You
Third Person Singular	He/She (They)	Him/Her (Them)

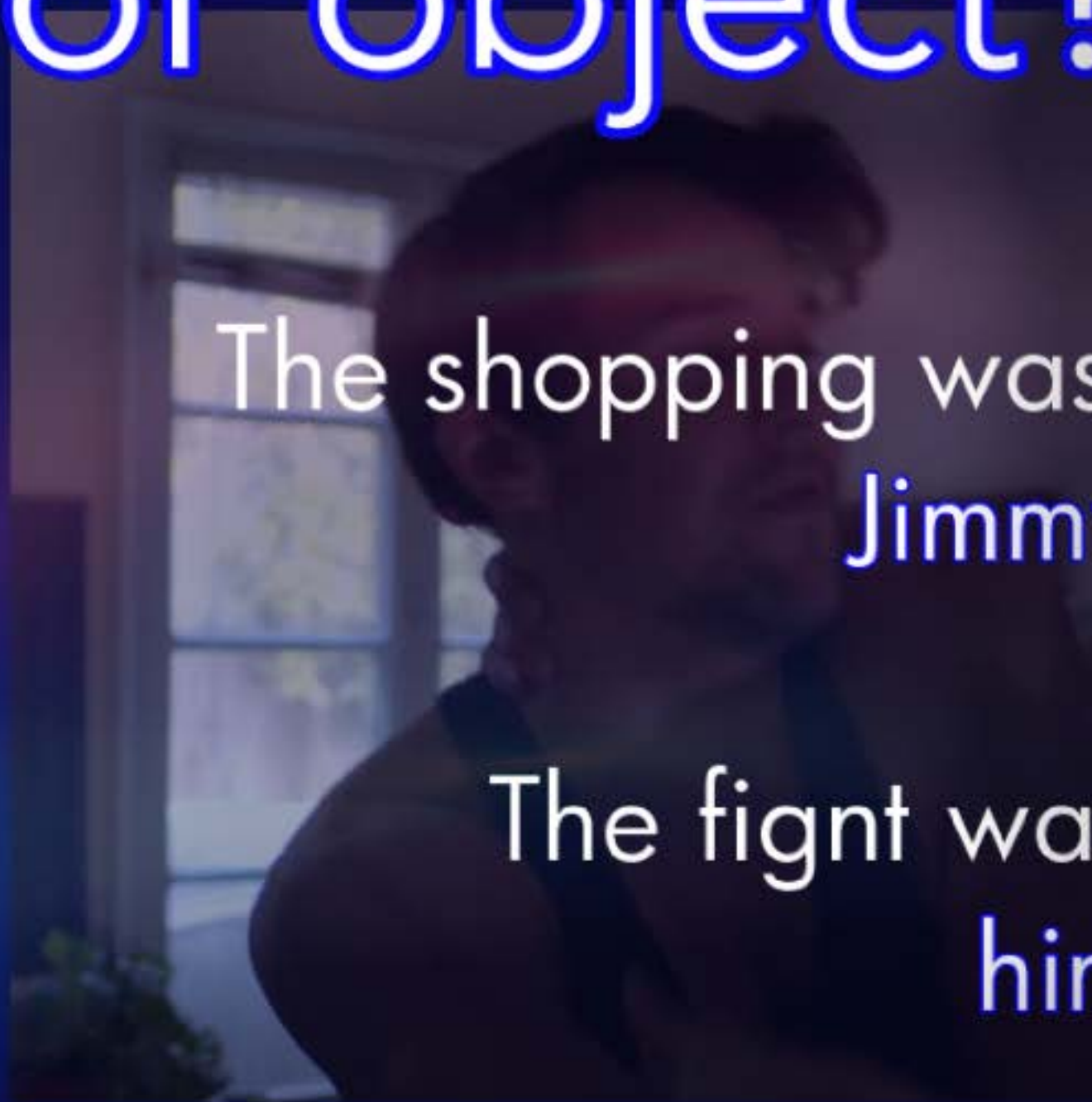
Jimmy and I went shopping.

now?

Jimmy and I / me.....

We went shopping.

Us went shopping.

Go shorthand

Replace both
pronouns with the
first person plural.

The respective first
person singular
is correct.
